Your name has been randomly selected from the State of Florida Registered Voters to complete a Juror Qualification Questionnaire for potential federal jury service in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Florida. You are **not** being summoned for jury duty at this time. This notice is to obtain information in accordance with 28 U.S.C. §1864 which will determine your eligibility to serve on a federal jury at a later date.

Completion of the questionnaire is **REQUIRED** by federal law. In an effort to reduce costs and qualify jurors in a timely manner, we ask that you complete the Juror Qualification Questionnaire online within 10 days from receipt of this letter. The questionnaire can be accessed on our secure website at www.FLND.uscourts.gov (see the box to the right for instructions).

If you do not have access to a computer, you may wish to check with your local library or ask to use the computer of a friend or relative. If none of these options are available, it is not necessary to contact the court. A paper form will automatically be mailed to those who do not respond via eJUROR. **Please note: Using a mobile device to complete the questionnaire is discouraged. If a mobile device is used, eJUROR may not function properly which could prevent the questionnaire from being submitted.**

The Juror Qualification Questionnaire must be completed and submitted regardless of age, citizenship status, criminal history, occupation, physical health, availability to serve, or place of residence. Some persons may be excused from future service based on the answers provided.

If you have questions, please refer to the list of frequently asked questions on the back of this letter before calling the court.

Trial by jury is a keystone of our system of justice and is, therefore, both an opportunity and an obligation of every American citizen. Your cooperation and participation in this important process is appreciated.

to access*

eJUROR

STEP 1: Visit the website
www.FLND.uscourts.gov

STEP 2: Click the eJUROR
link on the right side of the
screen.

STEP 3: Enter your 9-digit
participant number (located
below your name and
address), along with your
date of birth and the first
three letters of your last
name.

STEP 4: Follow the screen
prompts and answer each
question.

STEP 5: Review and
submit your answers by
clicking "Confirm" at the end
of the questionnaire.

Frequently Asked QUESTIONS

How do I know that eJUROR is secure?

The court follows current best practices for database and server security, maintained by highly-skilled court staff and supported by a dedicated national network security group. Internet Explorer and Firefox/Mozilla are the supported browsers for the eJUROR program. If you are using Safari, Chrome, iPhone, iPad or an Android phone or tablet and are having problems, please switch to one of the supported browsers.

What if I don't have a computer?

The court understands that not all prospective jurors have access to a computer. You may wish to check with your local library or ask to use the computer of a friend or relative. If none of these options are available to you, the court will send you a paper questionnaire for you to complete and mail back. DO NOT contact the court to request a paper form. A paper questionnaire will automatically be mailed to anyone who fails to complete the online questionnaire by the response deadline.

What if the recipient of this letter is deceased?

Please log into eJUROR using the deceased's name, participant number, and date of birth. On the second screen, indicate that you are filling out the form on behalf of the deceased. On the third screen, enter your name, address, and reason (i.e., relationship to the deceased in the response box. Mark that the addressee is deceased. Enter the date of death and click "Confirm." You may now log out of eJUROR.

What counties are included in the Northern District of Florida? What if I've moved?

The Northern District of Florida is comprised of the following 23 counties: Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Walton, Jackson, Holmes, Washington, Bay, Calhoun, Gulf, Leon, Gadsden, Liberty, Franklin, Wakulla, Jefferson, Taylor, Madison, Alachua, Lafayette, Dixie, Gilchrist, and Levy.

The four jury divisions for the Northern District of Florida are: Pensacola Division, Panama City Division, Tallahassee Division, and Gainesville Division.

If your address has changed you can use eJUROR to update your information. If you have permanently moved outside of the Northern District of Florida, please update your address and select "County Not Listed" in the county drop-down menu.

What if the recipient of this letter is away at college or on active military duty?

You can log into eJUROR and complete the questionnaire on your family member's behalf, or provide them with their participant number so that they can log in and complete the questionnaire.

What if I have a hardship that isn't covered by the online questionnaire?

If you are qualified and receive a summons in the future, you will have an opportunity to request to be excused, partially excused or postponed from jury service at that time. Keep in mind that completing the questionnaire only determines your eligibility for federal jury service. It does not necessarily mean that you will be required to serve as a juror.

There are two people at this address with the same name. How do I tell who is supposed to complete the Questionnaire?

Try logging into eJUROR with each person's information. Only the intended recipient's date of birth will provide access.
