ORDER AMENDING CASE ASSIGNMENTS

UPON CONSIDERATION of an equitable assignment of cases between Senior Judge Stafford and Judge Hinkle, it is hereby ordered that the Court's order of June 12, 1998, regarding the assignment of civil and criminal cases is amended as follows, effective immediately:

TALLAHASSEE DIVISION

All prisoner (510, 530, 550, 555); social security (861, 862, 863, 864, 865); forfeiture/penalty (610, 620, 625, 630, 640, 650, 660, 690); and bankruptcy (422, 423) civil cases shall be assigned on a rotating basis:

90% to Senior Judge Stafford

10% to Judge Hinkle

All other civil cases shall be assigned on a rotating basis:

50% to Senior Judge Stafford

50% to Judge Hinkle
