ORDER DIRECTING THE CLERK OF THE COURT TO NOTIFY BAR MEMBERS OF THE OPPORTUNITY TO REPRESENT THE PLAINTIFF PRO BONO

The clerk must send a notice to all attorneys registered with the court's electronic filing system. The notice must state:

This is notice of an opportunity to provide *pro bono* representation in the case of *Grasso v. Varner*, 4:21-cv-310-WS/MJF.

Plaintiff is suing three law enforcement officers for damages under 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Plaintiff alleges that two officers of the Florida State University Police Department seized and searched his cellular phone and searched his storage unit without a search warrant and in violation of the Fourth Amendment. He also asserts that a deputy from the Wakulla County Sheriff's Office searched his cellular telephone in violation of the Fourth Amendment.

These claims have survived Defendants' motions to dismiss. Docs. 60, 61. Defendants have filed answers and the case is now commencing the discovery phase. Docs. 64, 65.

¹ Plaintiff's claim against Ard Contracting Inc. has been dismissed. Doc. 46.

Public funds are not available for payment of attorney's fees. Fees may be recoverable under applicable law if Plaintiff prevails. See 42 U.S.C. § 1988. Limited funds sometimes are available from the District's Bench and Bar Fund for the payment of out-of-pocket expenses incurred by an attorney providing representation of this type.
