ORDER DIRECTING THE CLERK TO NOTIFY BAR MEMBERS OF THE OPPORTUNITY TO REPRESENT THE PLAINTIFF PRO BONO

The clerk must send a notice to all attorneys registered with the court's electronic filing system. The notice must state:

This is notice of an opportunity to provide pro bono representation in a jury trial. The case is Terrelle A. Tullis v. Matthew Wilson et al., Case No. 4:19cv225-RH-HTC.

The trial date will be set to accommodate an attorney who agrees to represent Mr. Tullis. The trial probably will take two or three days.

Mr. Tullis is a prisoner in the Florida Department of Corrections. On September 11, 2016, Mr. Tullis was in Gulf Correctional Institution in Wewahitchka, Florida. He alleges that on that day, correctional officers punched and kicked him and sprayed him with chemical agents, all without cause. He asserts a claim under the Eighth Amendment and 42 U.S.C. § 1983.

There are five remaining defendants. Their summary-judgment motions have been denied. The evidence is summarized in the magistrate judge's report and recommendation addressing the summary-judgment motions, ECF No. 70. No further discovery is anticipated. The case is ready for trial.

An attorney who wishes to represent Mr. Tullis may contact him directly and may enter the case by filing a notice of appearance.

Under a Florida Bar Foundation program, a law student may be available to provide representation under the supervision of an attorney. An attorney willing to supervise a law student, or who wishes to obtain more information about this possibility, may obtain information at <FloridaProBonoMatters.org>. Upon deciding to proceed, such an attorney may contact Mr. Allen and file a notice of appearance.

Access to the electronic docket will be made available without charge for consideration of a response to this notice.

An attorney who wishes to appear should file a notice of appearance as soon as the decision is made and in any event by December 15, 2021.
